**Mission and purpose:**

In 1985 Wallowa, Union and Baker counties established the Northeast Oregon Economic Development District to enhance community and economic development services in the region.

**NEOEDD's mission is to provide resources and facilitate quality decision making for the benefit of entrepreneurs, businesses and communities in Northeast Oregon.**

Our purpose:

- Help businesses start, survive and grow through loans and matched savings, product and market research and development, research of regulations, business planning, classes and referrals
- Help private Non-profit corporations survive and thrive through training and technical assistance on best management practices; grant and donor-based fundraising; feasibility studies and internal audits
- Help local governments and communities provide needed infrastructure and services through training and technical assistance for project development, financing, management and reporting; leadership training; and development of permanent local funding through community endowment funds.

**Key metrics/outcomes/impact for the past year:**

**Matched Savings for Business and Education** - Currently 15 participants enrolled in Wallowa County, saving >\$40,500 and leveraging > \$121,500 in matching funds to invest in their business or education.

**Loans** - \$5.5 million in loans in the region; 340 jobs retained; 425 jobs created; \$400,000 currently available to lend

**Grants** – More than \$5.8 million in grants written over the last five years for projects in the region

**Current top 3 priorities/focus areas:**

**Entrepreneurial Development**

- ▶ Fully utilize our loan and IDA funding and technical assistance to help more businesses start and grow

**Brownfields Assessment Program**

- ▶ Create more useable land through Phase I and Phase II environmental assessments for public or private property

**Food System Development**

- ▶ Strengthen diversified food production, processing and private/nonprofit partnerships

**Challenges that you most need help with, either from another organization or the community at large:**

Getting the word out about matched savings accounts – funds available now at \$3 match for \$1 saved.

Increasing collaboration and having enough staff time to spend with other organizations in the community to plan and implement projects.

**Top 3 opportunities you see for the coming year:**

**Local Business Investing (equity and loans)** - create a collaborative Economic Development structure to give individual investors more options to invest in vital local businesses

**Grow the Wallowa Fund** ([www.wallowafund.org](http://www.wallowafund.org)) – increase awareness of and donations for the Wallowa Fund to support projects and programs in Wallowa County

**Tourism development** – agritourism development and promotion; bicycle-related trail/road tourism development and promotion
