


5. County voters will be asked to establish a permanent rate limit for library district operations as authorized by ORS 357.261(4). The Library District will have authority to levy and collect general property taxes to create a library fund to finance library operations under ORS 357.410(6).


6. At its first public hearing on December 18, 2017, the County Commission received information about county library needs, economic feasibility, alternatives for library services, and the permanent tax rate limit. Under ORS 198.805 and ORS 199.462, the County Commission considered evidence relating to local comprehensive planning, economic, demographic and sociological trends, and projections pertinent to the proposal and whether the area could benefit from the proposed district. The County Commission has determined that the county will be benefited by the formation of a county library district.

7. The County Commission sets a second and final public hearing on this proposed district for February 5, 2018 at 10 AM at the Wallowa County Courthouse. At that time the County Commission will hear additional testimony and receive written comment on the formation of a library district.

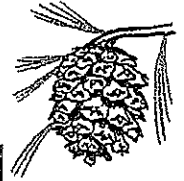




The City Council of the City of Enterprise hereby resolves:


